TEE RESULTS

53 year 12 Lesmurdie SHS students took part in the 2007 TEE (Tertiary Entrance Examination). 91% of our TEE students were eligible for University.

OUR 4 YEAR RECORD (top graph)

In any given year a number of schools like Lesmurdie SHS will out perform 70% of WA schools. Repeating this performance is much harder.

Over four years, from all 41 private schools (to year 12) South of the river only five could match our TEE record of leading 70% of all WA schools every year. They are All Saints' College, Murdoch College, Penrhos College, Santa Maria & Wesley College.

POST SCHOOL GOALS (centre graph)

92% of year 12 students achieved their goal.

WSA RESULTS

59% of the year 12 students completed WSA (Wholly School Assessed) studies in 2007. 70% of our WSA subject results out performed the state average based on the amount of A and B grades awarded. Four subjects made the 'Best 10 Schools' category in Dance, Furniture Design & Technology, Systems Technology and Technical Graphics.

HIGH COMPLETION RATE (graph)

The fact that more Year 8 students stay at Lesmurdie SHS through to Year 12 compared to other schools and their Year 8 students is an indicator that local families are pleased with Lesmurdie SHS.

Students that remain to Year 12 have less distractions as they enjoy

- a more stable social life at school
- a clearer understanding of our school's expectations
- consistent teaching when they have teachers from previous years. It is easier for teachers if they already know their students and how to get them to perform from day one.

Students that join Lesmurdie SHS after year 8 also benefit as there are less new students, compared to other schools, and our staff are able to focus on getting to know the new students.

GRADUATION


98% of our year 12 students graduated.

A number of Year 11 and 12 students took part in our Vocational Education and Training programs (VET) designed for students seeking employment or training after they leave school.


In 2007 Lesmurdie SHS was listed in the Top 50 Schools based on VET results.




JUST FIVE PRIVATE SCHOOLS SOUTH OF THE RIVER CAN MATCH OUR 4 YEAR RECORD







STUDENTS

The majority of Lesmurdie SHS students are well mannered and committed to achieving their goals as they prepare for adult life. An important factor in the high level of achievement is the value placed on education and on respect by our students.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

- 91% attendance Lesmurdie SHS
- 88% attendance WA state average

VALUE ADDING

Value Adding occurs when students of a certain ability improve at a rate considered to be greater than normal.

Lesmurdie SHS has implemented a number of programs specifically aimed at improving the performance and behaviour of students.

- Our Special Science & Maths program has seen a significant number of exceptionally high academic performances in 2007 interschool tests and competitions.
- Our School Volunteer Program (SVP) helps motivate students. A number of students who gain a mentor from the SWP improved their application and engagement at school and in the community.
- Student Services staff monitor our students' academic performance and provide counselling for students experiencing difficulties. This has resulted in a significant number of students taking action to improve their results.
- Our Students at Education Risk policy provides a process for identifying and providing specific support for students who may not be achieving their potential.

YEAR 9 STATE WIDE TESTS

Annual Monitoring Standards in Education (MSE) testing occurs across the state in years 3, 5, 7 and 9. 2007 MSE test results from Lesmurdie SHS are shown to the right. These results enable comparisons of our students with the rest of the state.


The percentage of our students above the benchmarks were;

STAFF ATTENDANCE

In 2007 there were 89 staff at Lesmurdie SHS. The average percentage of days attended per staff member was high:

- 99.4% attendance teachers
- 98.3% attendance all staff

STAFF RETENTION

At the end of each year most staff have the choice to remain for another year or transfer to another school. Of the 53 teachers and 7 heads of department of 2007, 70 percent have over 10 years teaching experience and over 50 percent have been in the school for at least 5 years.

• 79% of the 2006 teaching staff remained in 2007.

TEACHER QUALIFICATIONS

All teaching staff at Lesmurdie SHS meet the requirements to teach in Western Australian schools and all are registered with the Western Australian College of Teaching.

TEACHER TRAINING

All teaching staff engaged in the minimum of 9 days professional learning in 2007. To keep all teaching staff up to date with changes in education each state secondary school provides its teachers with access to professional learning or training.

Minimum training required per teacher	9 days
Actual training per teacher 2007 at Lesmurdie Senior High School	10.3 days
Cost of training per teacher	\$2884

Training costs include the cost of relief teachers and training fees incurred by training agencies or professional speakers.

STAFF COMMITMENT

Many staff at Lesmurdie SHS contributed towards the following extra programs that either enhanced the quality of education or provided extra curricula interests for students.

- Science lessons
 - Regular lunch time lessons were provided in some classes to help students.
- Tuition for tests and exams Exam revision & working through problems.
- Dance
 - Many hours of rehearsing for Rock Eisteddfod and other performances.
- Sports

Over 15 different teams held training sessions and competitions. Large events like carnivals, interschool competitions and outdoor education camps were also organised.

- Music
 - Several bands practised after school and held performances during the year.
- Drama

Lunch and after school rehearsals for a number of productions which were performed off the school grounds to a variety of audiences.

Community charity
Staff assisted student committees with holding activities through the year that raised money for the following groups; The Leukaemia Foundation and The Australian Orangutan Project.

The above list does not include social events like; river cruises, camps, student exchange programs, the school ball, dinners and school dances. These programs and activities were aimed at making student life more productive and enjoyable.

OUTLOOK

In 2007 Lesmurdie SHS worked on providing a school direction based on our new school vision 'Thriving in a nurturing environment'. With staff, student and parent consulation a Values statement and Principles of Teaching and Learning were agreed upon. There was strong support for fostering 'Respect' to be included in the Statements by both students and teachers.

These Statements will be refined for publishing in our School Plan 2008-2011. Measures will then be taken to reflect these statements in our school community.

IMPROVEMENTS

In 2007 substantial improvements were made to the grounds and buildings. These include:

- Establishing lawn and building a retaining wall in the corral area
- Installing our first Personal Address system throughout the school
- Connecting more classrooms and offices to our computer network
- Updating some computers
- Mounting digital projectors to ceilings in two rooms
- Installing three new photocopiers
- Upgrading an old room into a class room for the Challenge 10 group

- Making the school more accessible and friendly for disabled people
- Installing limestone retaining walls around garden beds
- Installing a large gardener shed and a cleaner and gardener office

The Parent and Citizens Group made considerable contributions which enabled the following improvements to be made around the school;


- Guitars for the Music Department

- Contributions towards the Chaplain Salary


INNOVATIVE COST SAVING








Job Link Program - Students landscaping 2007
